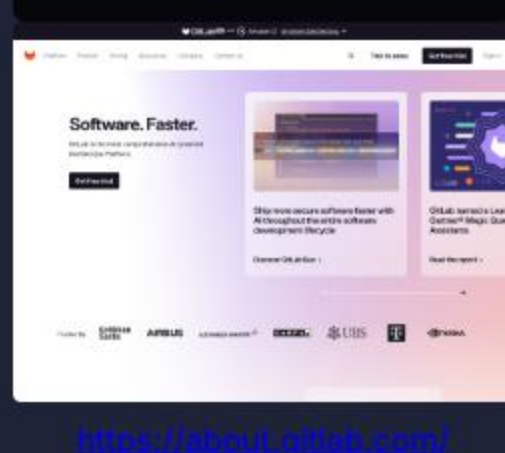
Best Aspects

The 'Unexpected Popup Obstructing Content' and the resulting 'Layout Shift/Content Overlap' is a usability nightmare; users will bounce if their experience is constantly interrupted. These problems, combined with missing navigation bar elements, create a frustrating and unprofessional first impression.

Key Suggestions

- Conduct a thorough accessibility audit of the HOME page and address all WCAG violations.
- Redesign the popup to be less intrusive and avoid layout shifts.
- Implement a comprehensive UI/UX review to improve usability and navigation.
- Establish a process for regularly updating and maintaining the HOME page to prevent future regressions.
- Consider incorporating accessibility testing into the development workflow to catch issues early.

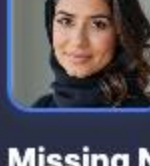
Priority Improvements

1. Implement alt text for all images on the HOME page to comply with WCAG guidelines.
2. Remove or modify the 'Unexpected Popup' to prevent content obstruction and layout shifts; consider alternative, less disruptive methods for displaying information.
3. Address the insufficient color contrast in the 'slp-btn-tertiary' button to meet WCAG standards.
4. Add a skip navigation link to improve keyboard navigation for users with disabilities.
5. Ensure all icon buttons have appropriate ARIA labels.
6. Remove redundant links with identical descriptions to streamline the user experience.

Why is this a bug?

In the mobile view, most of the top navigation bar elements, like 'Platform', 'Product', 'Pricing', 'Resources', 'Company', and 'Contact us', are missing. Only the search icon, logo and hamburger menu are visible. This significantly reduces the user's ability to navigate the site.

Suggested Fix

Ensure all navigation elements are accessible in the mobile view, either by displaying them directly or implementing a functional hamburger menu that displays them.

Why Fix This?

Navigation is critical for user experience; users must easily navigate to different sections of the website.

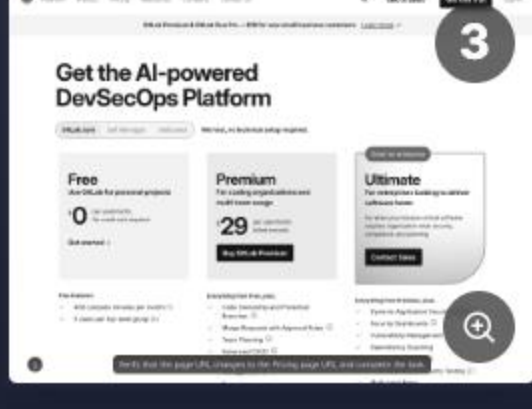
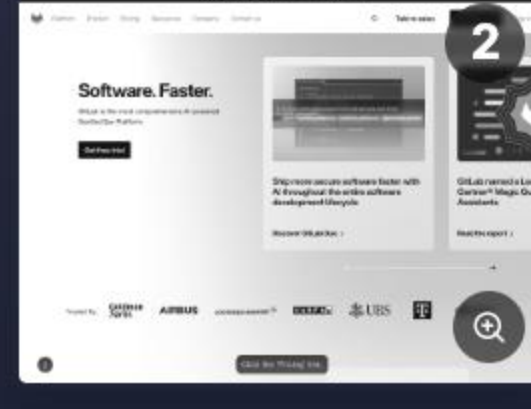
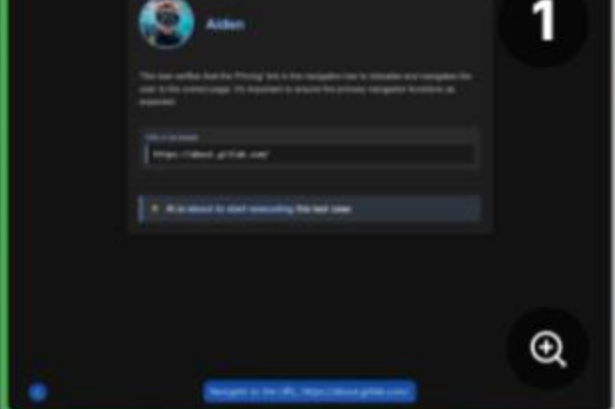
