

# AI Test Results from testers.ai



The HOME page of the 'Letshego' app presents a mixed bag. While there's no user panel feedback to consider, the sheer volume of bugs on this single page raises immediate concerns. The presence of a broken link ('Click here to view 2022 IAR') directly impacts functionality. Furthermore, numerous accessibility issues, like inadequate color contrast and missing alt text on the logo, are detrimental to usability for all users, especially those with disabilities. Addressing these issues is crucial.

## Best Aspects

There is no user panel data to glean a positive aspect. No security bugs reported other than a outdated jQuery library being referenced which means there is a potential security risk.

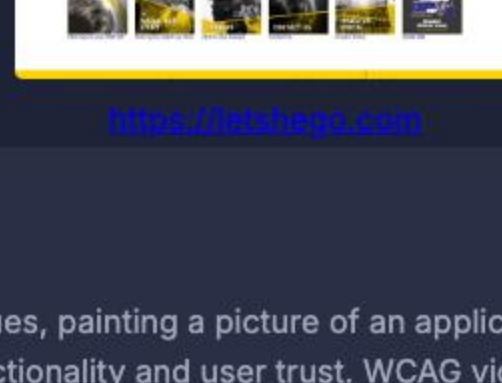
## Areas for Improvement

The HOME page has too many accessibility issues and a broken link, making it difficult to use and eroding user trust. This high volume of issues indicates significant shortcomings in the development and testing process.

### Detailed Analysis

The 'Letshego' app's HOME page is riddled with issues, painting a picture of an application needing significant attention. A critical broken link ('Click here to view 2022 IAR') impacts core functionality and user trust. WCAG violations are rampant with issues such as 'Inadequate Contrast on Footer Links' and 'Missing Alt Text on Logo', making the application difficult to use for individuals with disabilities. General bugs like the 'Search Bar and Select Country UI Issues' add to a sense of poor user experience. The outdated jQuery library is a potential security risk that needs to be addressed immediately. Overall, the app's HOME page needs major improvements to be considered a high quality app.

### Key Suggestions

- Conduct a thorough accessibility audit of the entire application.
- Implement automated accessibility testing as part of the development pipeline.
- Establish a clear process for link validation to prevent broken links.
- Update outdated libraries such as jQuery Migrate to prevent potential security risks.
- Refactor the Home page to correct UI issues related to the Search Bar and Select Country









### Priority Improvements

- Fix the broken link 'Click here to view 2022 IAR'. This is a critical functional issue.
- Address WCAG violations: Implement sufficient color contrast on footer links (ensure a minimum contrast ratio of 4.5:1 for normal text) and add descriptive alt text to the logo.
- Remove the outdated jQuery Migrate Library as its presence may open security vulnerabilities
- Fix issues related to Search Bar and Select Country UI
- Replace ambiguous link text like 'Click here' with more descriptive and informative text.

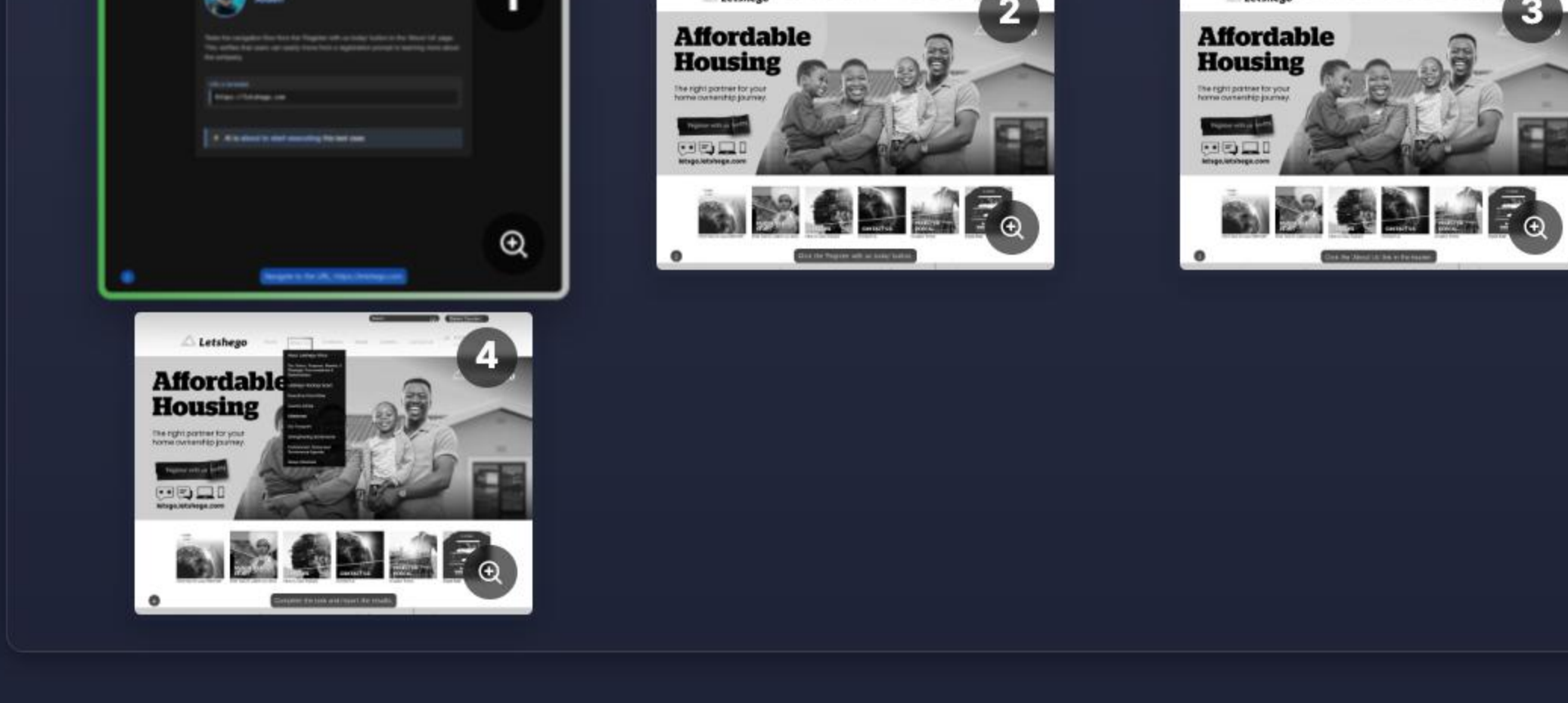

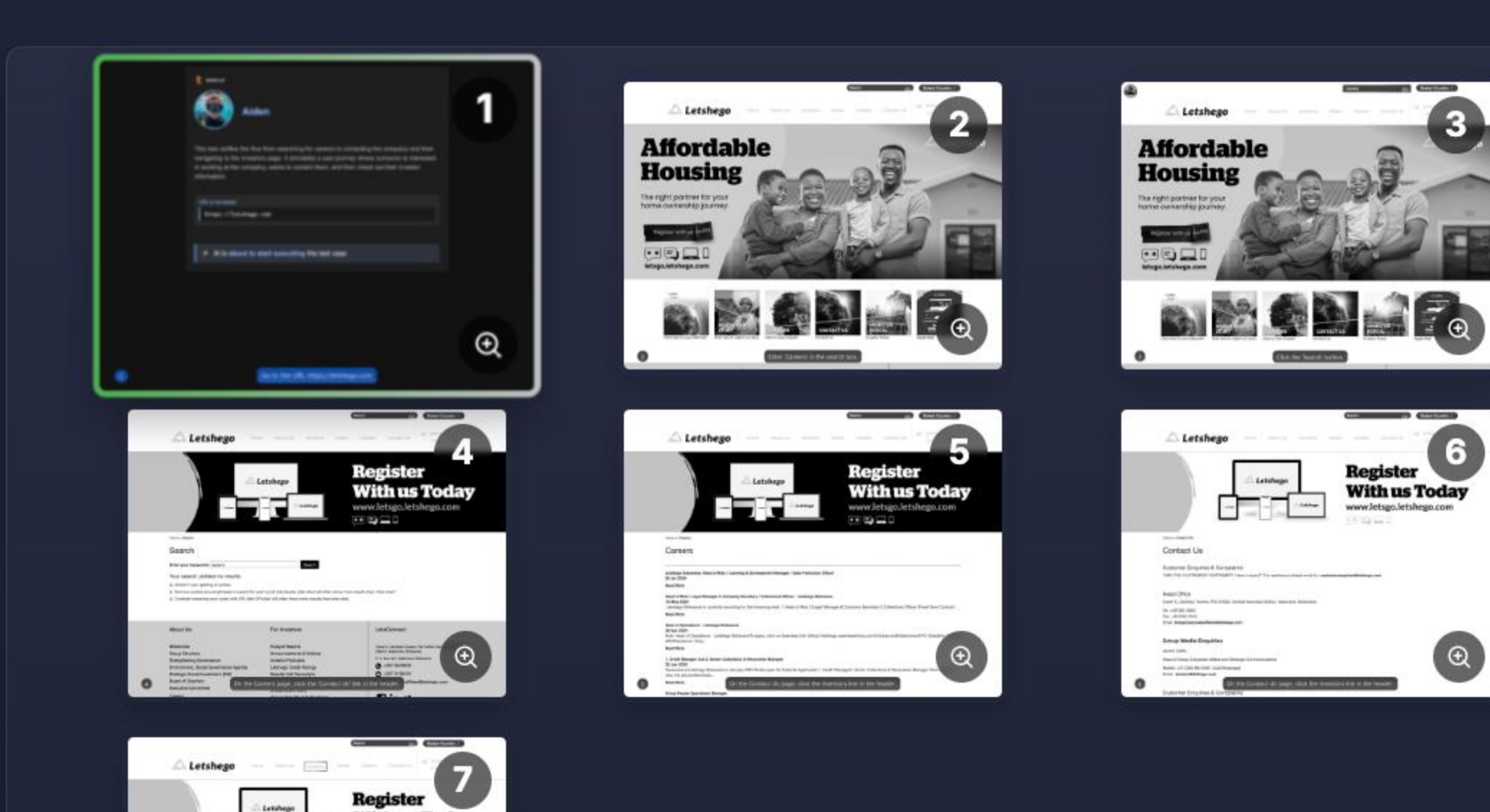
- ✓ Click 'Register with us today', then navigate to 'About Us'

Tests the navigation flow from the 'Register with us today' button to the 'About Us' page. This verifies that users can easily move from a registration prompt to learning more about the company.



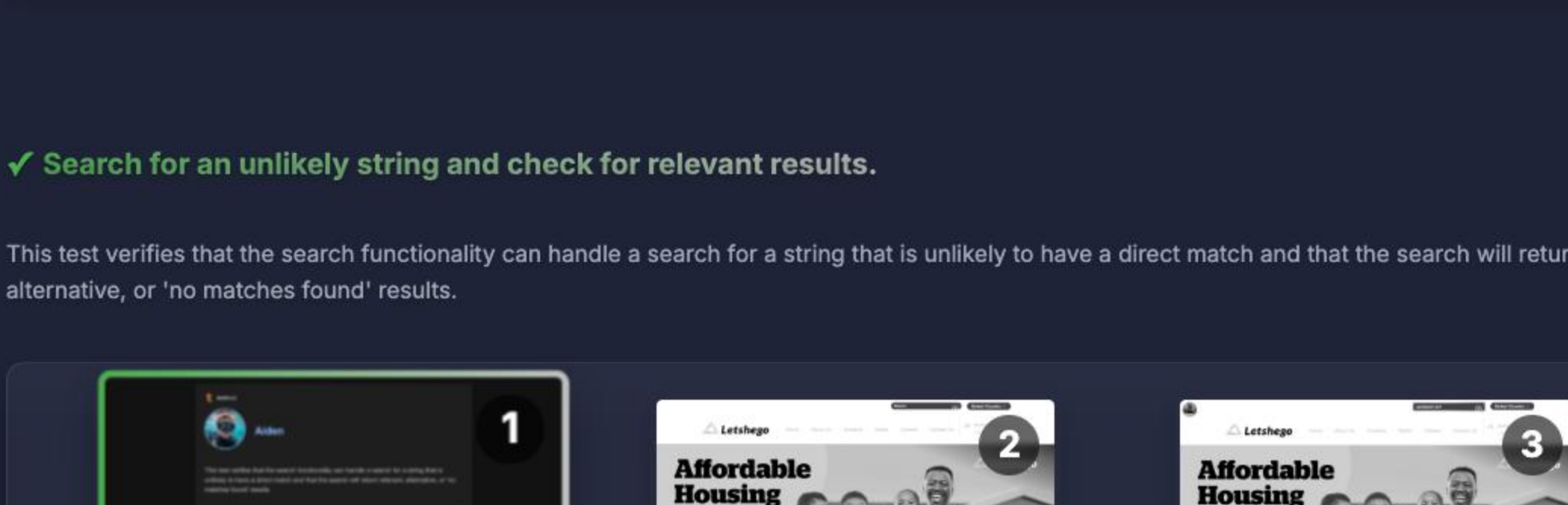
- ✓ Search Careers, then Contact Us, then Investors

This test verifies the flow from searching for careers to contacting the company and then navigating to the investors page. It simulates a user journey where someone is interested in working at the company, wants to contact them, and then check out their investor information.



- ✓ Search for an unlikely string and check for relevant results.

This test verifies that the search functionality can handle a search for a string that is unlikely to have a direct match and that the search will return relevant, alternative, or 'no matches found' results.


